Vancouver Warehouse Forklift Training Programs - Warehouses could either be industrial, commercial or retail facilities, functioning from bulk product retailing to product distribution services. Regardless of the kind of warehouse, personnel within warehouse settings must be well trained in safety measures related to material handling and storage, loading docks, conveyor systems, and pallet jacks and forklifts. Good housekeeping is essential to an orderly and safe warehouse environment.

The loading dock system is often built into the warehouse at a height from the ground making it easy to move stuff moving out and coming in of the warehouse. Personnel would likewise unload and load merchandise and materials from the elevated docks and ramps. Particular attention must be paid to safety habits during this stage. To be able to avoid falls, install yellow striping along the edge of ramps and docks. Pay attention to the area around delivery trucks that are parked at the loading dock, specifically the part between dock and the truck. Be certain that truck wheels are chocked when unloading.

To distribute products inside the facility, some warehouses utilize a conveyor system. These systems are designed with moving wheels and belts that could pose a pinch point hazard. Keep body parts and hair far away from conveyors to prevent injury. Elevated conveyors pose a hazard to workers below if safety nets are absent. Staff need to know how to stop conveyors in the event of emergency. Be aware of the location of off switches and emergency stop buttons. When servicing conveyors, tag out/lock out procedures are mandatory.

Pallet jacks and forklifts are designed to move materials around the warehouse. Operators of forklifts are required to take training and be given certification. Operators of pallet jacks do not need certification, but must be trained about the machine. Training courses instruct operators in the right methods for hoisting objects and moving them to their assigned place. Neither forklifts nor pallet jacks should ever be used to transport or lift employees.

Rack system and storage shelving help to create an efficient and orderly work space if they are braced, sturdy, and allow sufficient room for people and machinery to pass. Slow and careful placement of goods is needed to prevent accidents caused by products falling off the facing aisle. Aisles must be kept clear by storing products flat and inside the shelving units. Pallets are utilized for stacking products. They must be in good condition, and palletized products must be baled or shrink-wrapped, whenever possible.

Personal protective equipment (PPE) must be worn, as appropriate, to protect workers' limbs, heads, hands and feet. Bump caps or hard hats, steel-toed shoes and gloves are common PPE.

Slippery floors pocked with pits and dents present a danger. Good housekeeping practices involve keeping warehouse floors and docks clear of oil, dirt and debris. The area should be kept clear of garbage, boxes and baling supplies.
